- ❖ To assist the students to participate in various science outreach programmes.



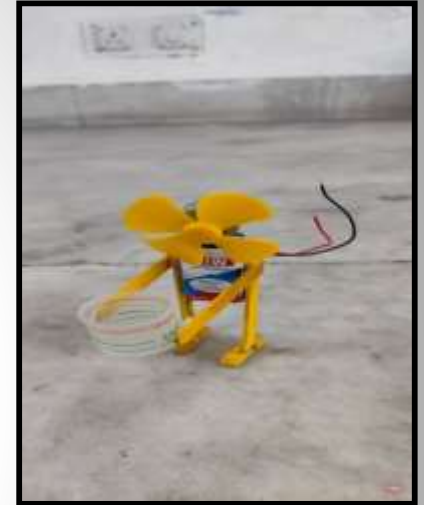
BEST OUT OF WASTE

❖ Aptitude test for class X students which helps them for their career counselling.

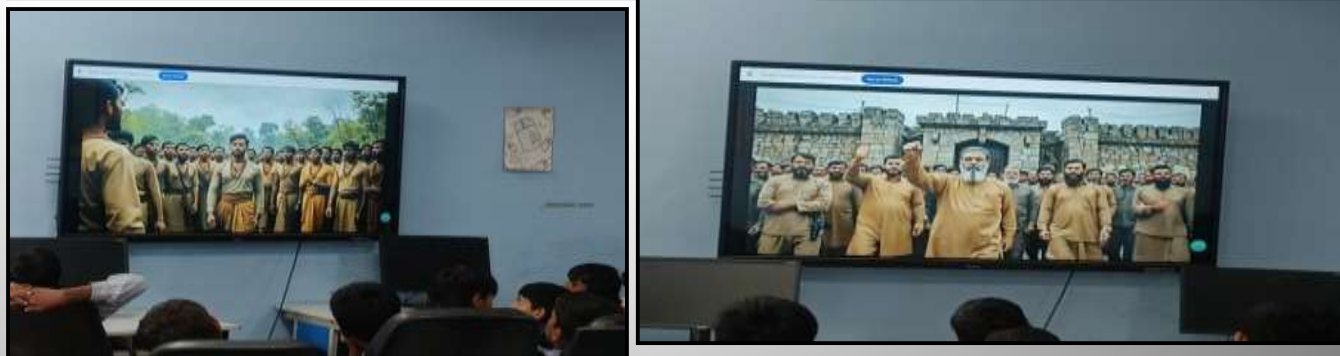


Virtual tour on documentary of Birsa Munda

❖ Birsa Munda is famous as a revered tribal freedom fighter and folk hero who led the Munda Rebellion (Ulgulan) in the late 19th century, fighting against British colonial exploitation and advocating for tribal land rights, self-rule, and cultural identity.

❖ He became a spiritual leader, known as "[Dharti Aba](#)" (Father of the Earth), uniting his people to resist oppressive policies and demand control over their Jal (water), Jungle (forest), and Jamin (land).

❖ His legacy led to significant land rights legislation, like the [Chotanagpur Tenancy Act](#), and his birth anniversary, November 15, is now celebrated as [Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas](#) (Tribal Pride Day) in India.



COMPETITION ON VANDE MATRAM

"Vande Mataram" (I bow to thee, Mother) is India's National Song, a powerful anthem of patriotism composed by Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay, symbolizing India as a mother goddess and serving as the rallying cry for the freedom struggle against British rule, inspiring unity and national awakening, officially adopted by the Constituent Assembly in 1950..

"Bal Vivah Mukh Bharat"

(Child Marriage Free India) is a national campaign launched by India's Ministry of Women & Child Development (MWCD) in late 2024 to eradicate child marriage by 2030, focusing on awareness, legal enforcement (PCMA 2006), community participation, and empowering girls, aiming for a 'Whole of Government' and 'Whole of Society' approach through portals, CMPOs, and grassroots action for a healthier, educated future for all children.

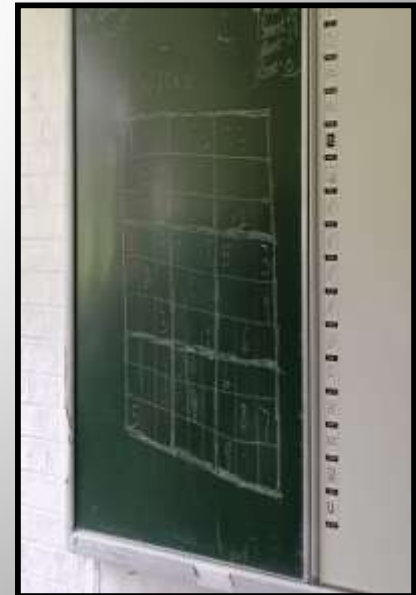

NATIONAL DEWORMING DAY

National Deworming Day (NDD) in India is a bi-annual health initiative launched in 2015 to combat Soil-Transmitted Helminths (STH) in children aged 1-19 years. Held on February 10 and August 10, it aims to reduce malnutrition and anemia by providing free Albendazole tablets at schools and Anganwadi centers, with a "mop-up" day for missed doses



WETLAND DAY

World Wetlands Day is celebrated annually on February 2nd to raise awareness about the vital role of wetlands—such as swamps, marshes, and mangroves—in protecting biodiversity, providing clean water, and mitigating climate change. It marks the adoption of the [Ramsar Convention on Wetlands](#) in 1971.



NO TOBACCO DAY

World No Tobacco Day (May 31) in schools involves nationwide awareness campaigns, such as the 2025 "Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 3.0," featuring rallies, Nukkad Nataks (street plays), poster-making, specialized assemblies. Schools enforce Tobacco-Free Educational Institution (ToFEI) guidelines, including 100-yard, smoke-free zones and student-led pledges to promote healthy, tobacco-free lives.



VIDYANJALI YOJANA

Vidyanjali Yojana (now often referred to as the Vidyanjali portal/initiative) is a Ministry of Education program designed to strengthen government and government-aided schools by encouraging community, volunteer, and private sector involvement. It facilitates donations of assets, materials, equipment, and services (like mentoring or teaching) to improve school quality.



BEST PRACTICES(BLOCK PRINTING & CLAY MODELLING)

The best art and craft practices in schools integrate creative, hands-on projects with academic learning and sustainability, fostering fine motor skills, critical thinking, and emotional expression.

Block printing is a fun, hands-on way for students to create repeatable designs on paper or fabric. It works like a handmade stamp: you carve a pattern into a material, apply ink, and press it onto a surface.

Clay modelling for students is an engaging, tactile activity that improves fine motor skills, spatial awareness, and creativity. Using materials like air-dry clay or plasticine, students can create shapes, animals, and miniature objects, aiding in cognitive development and emotional expression. It is a versatile, relaxing art form suitable for all ages.



BEST PRACTICES(MOSIAC ART)

Mosaic art is a highly accessible and engaging creative activity for students, ranging from simple paper collages for younger learners to intricate tile work for older students.

It involves arranging small fragments of material (called tesserae) to create a larger image or pattern.

Key Educational Benefits

Fine Motor Skills: Hand-eye coordination is refined through the precise placement of small pieces.

Historical Context: Many lessons tie mosaics to Ancient Roman and Greek history, providing a cross-curricular link to social studies.

Patience & Focus: The time-consuming nature of the craft encourages concentration and "artistic mindfulness".
